



Moms and babies need good follow-up care

The state of Mississippi is here to help

The time after giving birth is called the postpartum period. This time is full of change, and for some, it means increased risk to their health. **That's why the state of Mississippi has extended its postpartum Medicaid coverage from 60 days to 12 months.** Mothers will keep their coverage for 12 months after giving birth, even if their income goes up.

Medicaid-covered maternity care services

Medicaid covers pregnant women before, during and after giving birth. This care is important to check the health of the mother and baby. It can help doctors address problems that may come up.

- **Prenatal care** – Medicaid covers routine checkups, prenatal vitamins and ultrasound exams leading up to the birth. If a woman needs other health care during pregnancy, Medicaid will also cover those services.
- **Labor and childbirth** – Medicaid covers all care during delivery, including the cost of the hospital stay.
- **Postpartum care** – Medicaid covers follow-up care for moms, plus well-child checks and immunizations for babies.

Who is eligible?

This change only applies to pregnant people who qualify for Medicaid. They must be enrolled under the state plan while pregnant.
