Make an appointment with your child's primary care provider (PCP) today

Kids with asthma can have a normal life. If their asthma is controlled, kids can go to school, play with their friends and be active in sports or other activities.



See your child's PCP, it's important

- Your child's asthma can be managed with a PCP's help.
- Talk to your child's PCP about your child's health.
- Together, you can start or update your child's care plan.

- See your child's in-network PCP for this visit.
- Your child's PCP is the main provider your child sees for most of his or her care.
- Remember to bring your child's member ID card to the visit.



Get help with your child's appointment

- From scheduling your child's next checkup appointment to finding a PCP, count on us to help your child get the care they need, as soon as they need it.

What to expect at your child's visit.

- 1. Your PCP will go over your child's Asthma Action Plan to make sure it's up-to-date. If you don't already have an Asthma Action Plan, your PCP will help you write one.
- 2. Bring your child's asthma medicines to the appointment. Be sure your child is using his or her medicines exactly as the PCP says.
- 3. Talk to your PCP about exercise that's right for your child and how to avoid attacks.
- 4. Know the signs of a serious asthma attack and when to get emergency medical help.

- Know the triggers that make your child's asthma symptoms worse.
- Keep track of asthma attacks. This can help you spot patterns and warning signs.
- Share your child's Asthma Action Plan with your child's school, day care, sports group and anyone else who spends time with your child.
